Mission

The Christi Center offers hope after the death of a loved one by providing support networks, community education, and therapeutic activities that are free, peer-based, and ongoing.

The Christi Center has been providing grief and loss support in the form of peer-to-peer support groups to adults, teens, and children five and older in Central Texas for 35 years. Support groups are facilitated by trained volunteers under the direction of clinical staff, many of whom have also experienced a similar loss to others in the group.

Since grief does not have a cure and requires ongoing maintenance, our services are available for as long as a person or family needs and are always free of charge.

Who We Serve

The Christi Center partners with schools, foster care facilities, criminal justice agencies, civic and service organizations, businesses, churches and other community groups. We cross-refer with over 150 community agencies to ensure that we can meet the broad range of needs grieving families have. Our services are open and available to all of Central Texas, with group locations in Austin and Georgetown.

At the heart of the organization is the Center's peer-based grief support group model, which "normalizes" the grief experience by connecting the bereaved with others who have experienced losses of a similar nature, showing them that hope is possible after loss.

Vision

Through the Christi Center's work, we ensure that no one in Central Texas has to grieve alone.



MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Dear Christi Center Supporter,

In late October of 2021, I was proud to join the Christi Center as Executive Director. I was compelled by the Christi Center's simple but powerful vision: no one in Central Texas has to grieve alone.

While the pandemic lingered throughout a second year, the Christi Center team was undaunted - finding innovative ways to support our members during trying times. We offered an average of 35 group session meetings monthly for hundreds of individuals, totaling 13,275 interactions. Additionally, we trained 1,332 individuals in grief education and bereavement support

Our unique, proven model is grounded on a premise of free, ongoing, peer-based support groups serving the unique needs of our members based on age or type of loss. In 2021, we provided specialized groups for:

- loss of a partner
- loss of a child
- pregnancy and infant loss
- mixed loss (i.e., sibling, parent, etc.)*
- children's individual counseling*
- teen group

- Spanish speaking group
- COVID-19 loss
- loss to suicide*
- loss to overdose*
- loss to crime

*fastest growing/greatest demand


Coming home to the Christi Center

On October 21st, the Christi Center held our fundraising luncheon at the Austin Country Club known as Heart Connections.



2021 REVENUE: \$513,000






How to Help
